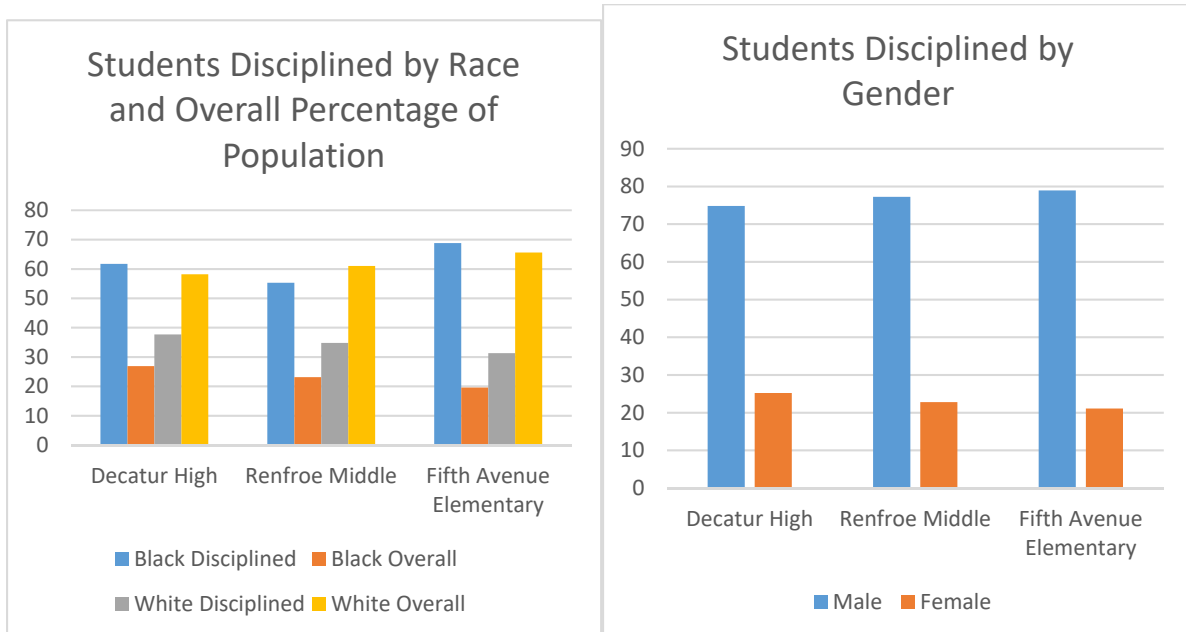
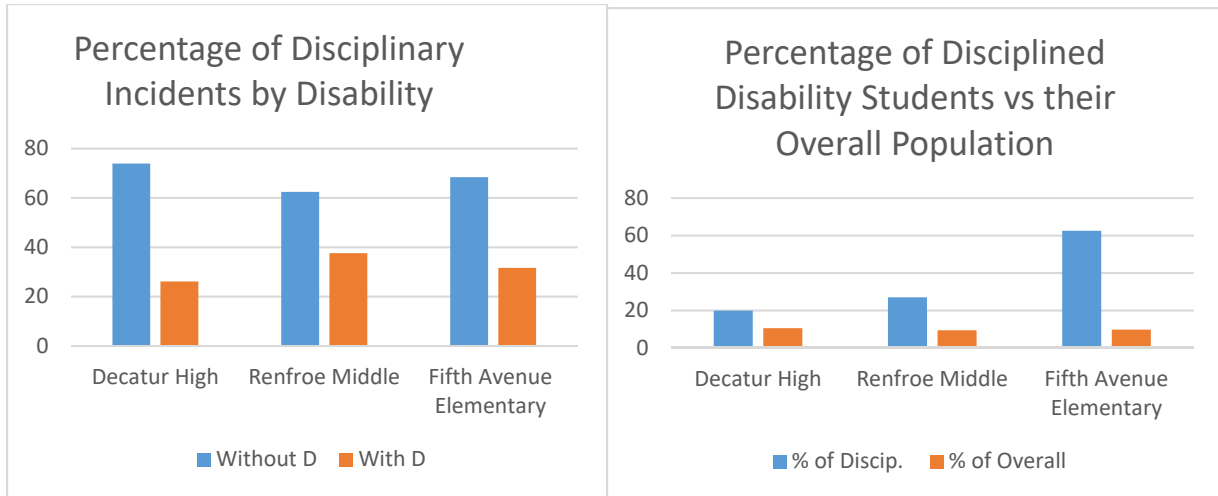
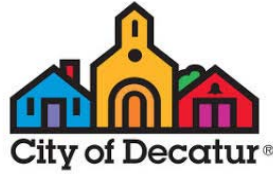


2019 Disciplinary Data for Decatur High School, Renfroe Middle School and Fifth Avenue Elementary

School Demographics

Decatur High School: 57% white; 31% African American; 5% Latino; 2% Asian.

Renfroe Middle School: 61.3% white; 23.1% African American; 6.5% two or more.

Fifth Avenue Elementary School: 64.1% white; 20.4% African American; 8.2% two or more.

Additional Information About Discipline

Decatur High School. Only students with disabilities, females and white students were physically restrained. Only males placed in alternative schools. Only black students, either with or without disabilities, were placed in detention or in alternative schools. Students without disabilities were more likely to receive detention, out of school suspension, in school suspension or placement in an Alternative School, than *students with disabilities who were more likely to be physically restrained.*

Renfroe Middle School. Students with disabilities were the only ones removed from class, whereas students without disabilities were the only ones receiving detention. Greater number of black students placed in detention or out of school suspension but numbers were somewhat evenly distributed across white and black students for other disciplinary consequences. Males were the only ones receiving detention and the only ones removed from the class. *We can assume that black boys with disabilities are the one who are removed from class.*

Fifth Avenue Elementary. Students with disabilities were the only ones receiving “other” consequences, presumably detention, classroom removal or placement in an alternative school. Black students were the only ones receiving “other” consequences. Males were the only ones who received “other” consequences.
